> 11. 2011 Chair's report: Please provide a narrative of the past year's activity/successes/challenges:

OVERVIEW

There were 43 Section member volunteers, assisted by 40 undergraduate chemistry students, who engaged in projects and activities: 28 for ACS members (1,690 contacts); 42 for PR and outreach to non-chemists (71,450 contacts). Please see highlights of the major activities contained in the attached Chair's Annual Report.

MAJOR INITIATIVES in 2011 Communications Task Force

It has become increasingly apparent that the Executive Committee, and its supporting committees, find it very difficult to communicate with our nearly 2000 Section members in timely and targeted ways. Partly this is the result of not having fully integrated the numerous kinds of content that we need to communicate, relative to the numerous electronic channels of communication available, while still recognizing that paper has a role too. Partly this is the result of the number of electronic channels of communication themselves, which require significant attention to sort out their pros and cons. Therefore, I asked the Executive Committee to authorize the formation of a Communications Task Force. To guide the Task Force, I created a spreadsheet to analyze the complex issues of who [sources] needs to communicate what [content] by what means [channels, esp. electronic] to what audiences. (Please see the FORMS activity entry for this document.) This document will assist in identifying future needs and solutions.

- Meeting announcements

The Task Force determined that our most pressing problem was to find a way to make the meeting announcements more timely. Our solution was to decouple them from the newsletter, and instead distribute them as a synoptic e-mail (standard 1-screen format), which includes a link to our website where the speaker's bio, picture, and topic are presented in a visually-appealing, standard PDF format. This avoids the unacceptable issue of e-mailing this "heavy" PDF to 2000 members.

- Employment opportunities
The Section has large numbers of employers (6 colleges and 6 universities; several state and federal labs; >300 chemical businesses). Therefore, the Section has an obligation to provide a one-stop forum for employment opportunities. The Task Force addressed this need by creating an open group named Georgia Section/ Employment Opportunities on the ACS Network, to which any ACS member may upload a job description.

Senior Chemists Initiative

senior Chemists Initiative
It has become increasingly difficult to find people who are
willing to serve in elected office, or even to serve as chairs
of supporting committees. It appeared to me that retirees
might be a good source of personnel, and the Silver Circle initiative seemed to support that. Therefore, the Executive Committee approved a proposal (please see the FORMS activity entry for this document) to assess the extent of interest, and availability, of the nearly 200 retired and emeritus ACS members in the Section, to engage in the work of the Section. This resulted in identification of two very well-qualified nominees for Chair-Elect, plus another member who is now active in two committees

Technical Division/ Chemical Businesses Group Initiative 75% of our membership (1,500 members) are employed by the more than 300 small chemical businesses (1-50 employees), and the more than 50 larger chemical businesses (>50 employees), that operate within our Section's territory. Yet only 10-20% of the attendees at any dinner meeting are from this large segment of our membership. Furthermore, there are only 6 members in the Section who belong to the Small Chemical Businesses Division. Therefore, the Executive Committee approved a proposal (please see the FORMS activity entry for two documents) to launch this initiative. This Group now has a very well-qualified Chair, and 6 members from businesses. and will function as the local affiliate of the Small Chemical Businesses Division.

Bylaws Review Task Force

During the course of the year, it became apparent that our Bylaws, even though they were adopted in 2005, are significantly misaligned with the realities of the Section as

	it, and its operating environment, have evolved. Therefore, the Executive Committee approved a proposal (please see the FORMS activity entry for this document) to initiate a complete review of the Bylaws. Our intent is to adopt as much of the Model Section Bylaws as may be appropriate, and to simplify the Bylaws. Simultaneously, we will draft an Administration Manual to complement the Bylaws.
	Summary These initiatives address some basic infrastructure issues within the Georgia Section, and should serve the Section well in the future. In addition, all the other activities that are described in the Chair's Annual Report, and in the 37 FORMS entries, indicate that the Section has much energy and enthusiasm.

Increasing the different number of activities/events/outreach (as elaborated below) and providing better communication in 2012, will be the driving forces for this challenge.
	? Expand exposure to different demographics targeting younger and non-traditional chemists. Through this, I'm hoping the Section would see more involvement from those demographics within the organization through our monthly meetings and committees, YCC and any outreach programs.
	? Expand the local chapter's member attendance of those serving in roles in industry. I would like to see those in industry use the Section for networking and resources and to strengthen relationships within the community, and as a result the Section gains more local industry knowledge and forming of partnerships. These initiatives can be formed from the new Chemical Businesses Group.
	? An increased number of members that become more active in the local section. We have a 1900+ member organization and we need more involvement from those that are members. Not only would the Section gain value from this increase, but the community would as well, with more members volunteering time to help support events such as WCC, Science Fairs, and Educational programs.

b. What are your concerns and challenges?*	Demographics The demographics of the Georgia Section are not completely understood. While many of our members come from top-notch colleges and universities, national brand companies, and renowned Government Agencies, we believe a significant number are situated at small to medium-sized enterprises. The challenge is to identify and reach out to these members so that activities are planned that encourage more active participation.
	Geographic locations The Georgia section membership is concentrated within the metro Atlanta area. However, the geographical area of the section is much larger, and includes several remote areas that may have been under-served by past activities. The challenge is to develop ways and programs that include these outlying areas without sacrificing attendance of those from the core region.
	Networking with entrepreneurs Like most of the country, members of the Georgia section have been faced with employment challenges because of the ongoing recession. Fortunately, many have landed, launched successful new ventures, or moved into non- traditional positions. These people have a great deal that they could share with others in transition who may be considering a similar path. The challenge is to find a vehicle that will foster such sharing without putting a huge time burden on participants who are already stretched thin. Certainly, identifying and providing mutual benefits that such networking provides will be key.

The Chair's Annual Report demonstrates that the Section is very active in many areas of standard programming, e.g. Community Activities, Education, Public Relations. There were 43 Section member volunteers, assisted by 40 undergraduate chemistry students, who engaged in 70 projects and activities: 28 for ACS members (1,690 contacts); 42 for PR and outreach to non-chemists (71,450 contacts). However, the Section has infrastructure issues in the areas of:

-communications

-recruitment to elected offices and committees

-involvement of the 75% of its membership who are employed in chemical businesses

-bylaws that no longer reflect the evolution of the Section and its operating environment.

These issues were addressed as follows.

Communications Task Force

The Executive Committee authorized the formation of a Communications Task Force. This Task Force will analyze the complex issues of WHO [sources] needs to communicate WHAT [content] by what MEANS [channels, esp. electronic] to what AUDIENCES. The two issues of immediate concern for which the Task Force found solutions were:

-to improve the timeliness of our meeting announcements - to provide a one-stop forum for employment opportunities within the Section

Details of these solutions are provided in the Chair's report.

Senior Chemists Initiative

The Executive Committee authorized an initiative to invite senior chemists to active involvement in the elected offices and committees of the Section. This resulted in identification of two very well-qualified nominees for Chair-Elect, plus another member who is now active in two committees. This invitation will be offered annually to identify new retirees who may be interested in active involvement in the Section.

Technical Division/ Chemical Businesses Group Initiative The Executive Committee approved a proposal to launch this initiative as a Chemical Businesses Group affiliate of the Small Chemical Businesses Division. This Group now has a very well-qualified Chair, and 6 members from businesses, and it is actively planning its future.

Bylaws Review Task Force

The Executive Committee approved a proposal for a complete review of our Bylaws, along with development of a complementary Administration Manual. This Task Force is advancing this work.
